ANNUAL REPORT 2014-15

Chair's Report

This has been my first full year as Chair of the newly elected committee that took office in April 2014.

It has been another year in which the LPC has made great strides but has had also to face considerable challenges. Our CEO, Yogendra Parmar, has been the key driver in allowing us to face these challenges. Yogendra has been a great asset to the LPC and indeed all of us as individual contractors. He is full of energy, has a deep understanding of the issues facing contractors and has an ability to network and connect with commissioners, which has had a significantly beneficial impact on outcomes for us contractors.

The transition from PCTs to the complex new environment of CCGs, NHS England and Local Authority Public Health Commissioning has had a significant impact on Community Pharmacy. Although PCTs ceased to exist 4 years ago the ramifications of the reorganisation are still being felt by pharmacy in Camden & Islington. Maintaining the commissioning of Enhanced Services that had been commissioned historically by PCTs was a vital piece of work the LPC undertook this year. Strong lobbying and representations to the new commissioners was needed, and a clear demonstration of the benefits to our patients and the NHS as a whole was required to ensure these services were not decommissioned. As a result the MDS and Minor Ailments services have been maintained in the face of decommissioning intentions from some local commissioners

Ensuring contractors continued to receive payments for Enhanced Services by the new commissioners also continues to prove very demanding. Breaking through the bureaucracy of these organisations, has proved very challenging. We have recovered missing payments to contractors of £50,000 and we continue to chase well over £50,000 of missing payments on behalf of contractors for the current and previous years. Our Pharmacies have delivered these services in good faith; commissioners must honour the associated payments.

Pursuing new sources of income for contractors has been an aim of the LPC. In this period we continued to support the commissioning of the Pan-London Pharmacy vaccination service, which vaccinated over 100,000 people over the 14-15 season. In addition we continue to develop new services with new commissioners and organisations such as the "Ageing Better bid" with Age UK Camden (Lottery funded), Healthy Living Pharmacies (Local Authority funded) and coordinated access to Apprenticeship Funding (Government and LETB funded). For any contractor looking to employ a new member of staff the Enhanced Apprenticeships provides £1500 of government funding as well as recruiting and training support. I can highly recommend this as a way to recruit staff. If you are interested in recruiting an Apprentice, contact CITE at Liz@cite4jobs.org or call 02030028149

Supporting the Local Authorities to develop robust PNAs (Pharmaceutical Needs Assessments) which protect the excellent existing network of pharmacies in our

CEO Report

This the first year of a new LPC Committee, which has a makeup of 9 contractor members (elected by ballot) and 4 CCA members (appointed by the Company Chemists Association).

The newly elected committee took office from 1st April 2014 and will represent the contractors for a period of 4 years from that date. The committee increased in size from 11 to 13, this resulted in an additional CCA place on the committee. The LPC operates a strict procedure for corporate governance and conflicts of interest. All members have signed up to these standards.

Camden & Islington LPC continues to constructively engage with the new NHS and Social Care system on your behalf. 2014/15 has been another hectic year. The committee has been busy:

- Finalising negotiations on the Local Authority and NHS standard contracts in Camden and Islington respectively,
- Negotiating and overseeing the reprourement of service commissioned by Public Health in Camden
- Developing and promoting the Pharmacy Enhanced Apprenticeship program
- Working with Age UK Camden to develop and roll out a new remunerated service for contractors in Camden to provide screening for isolated older people.
- Influencing the new PNAs and responding to the respective consultations
- Developing and negotiating the partnership with ToHealth to expand NHS Healthcheck provision through Camden Pharmacies, so providing a new income stream to contractors
- Conducting a root and branch cost analysis of the LPCs costs to ensure the LPC is delivering value for money for its contractors
- Introducing new comprehensive governance policies and procedures
- Chasing down outstanding payments from commissioners owed to contractors for Enhanced Services they have provided
- Protecting contractor income by preventing Enhanced Services being decommissioned

This is by no means a comprehensive list of the committees' activities over the year, but provides a flavour of some of the work undertaken on your behalf.

We hope that you find this report helpful and welcome your continued support, feedback and engagement with the LPC in the forthcoming year.

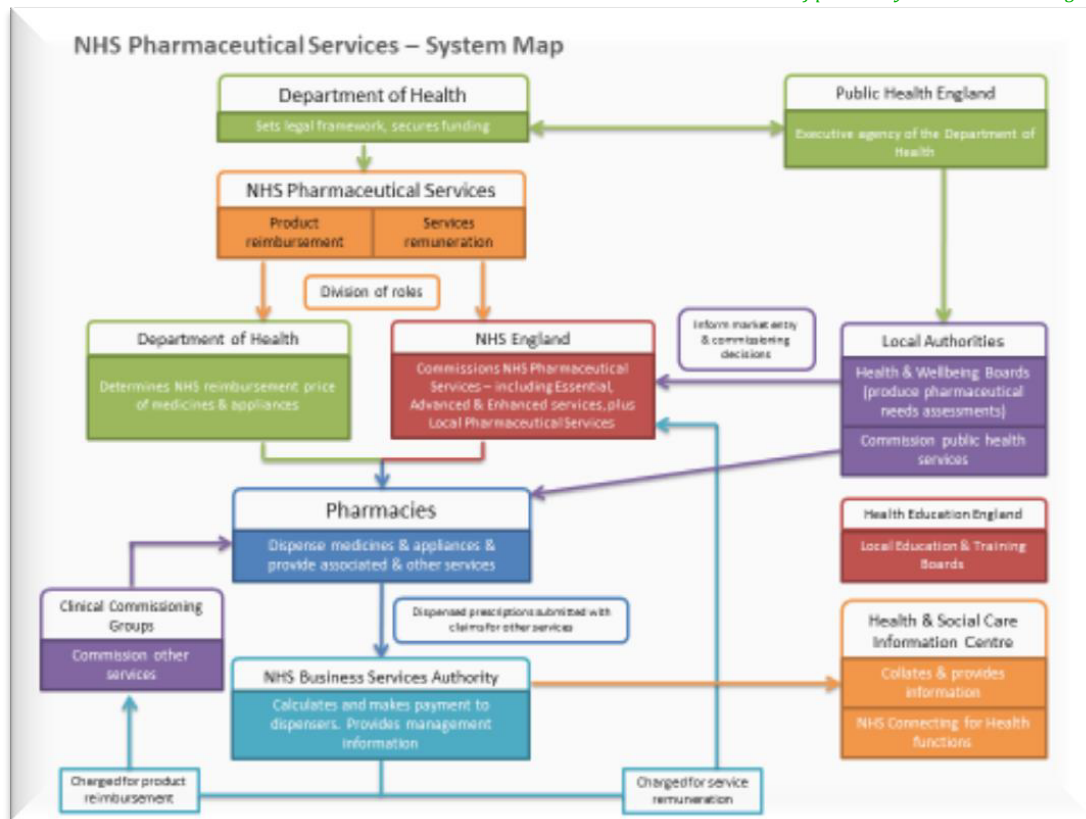
Please do get in touch as we represent you and without your input we cannot continue to progress.

Services Update

From 1 April 2013, the responsibility for commissioning of Public Health Services e.g. EHC, substance misuse, smoking cessation and NHS Health Checks passed to Local Authorities (LAs). In Camden & Islington there is a joint Public Health team with the remit of providing public health services to their respective populations.

Most commissioners wish to maintain the status quo during this period of continued austerity, so there have been limited opportunities for pharmacies to alter their portfolio of commissioned services. Some services were at significant risk of being decommissioned. We successfully

- averted such decommissioning
- agreed the removal of perverse commissioning barriers
- negotiated more favourable Smoking Cessation remuneration from 15/16 and recognition of the national level 2 smoking cessation qualification
- developed an agreement with one of the outreach lifestyle services providers in Camden, ToHealth, to allow Camden Pharmacies to provide NHS Healthchecks under contract for ToHealth.

For 2015/16 Public Health had to adopt a preferred provider tender approach. This was most obvious in Camden. In January 2015 all Camden Public Health commissioned services were reprocured. With an increase in the number of Pharmacies commissioned to provide most services. This was a very time consuming and at times problematic process for all parties (Commissioner, Contractor and LPC). Thankfully Islington CCG agreed to waive the full

reprocurement process in Islington. This is a classic example of the very different approaches to commissioning that arise as a result of the (new) fragmented NHS. The contracts to provide these services are onerous to say the least and are a far cry from the short SLAs Pharmacy had been used to in previous years.

During the 2014/2015 influenza season pharmacies across Camden & Islington signed up to the London Pharmacy Winter Vaccination Service. This service allowed Pharmacies across London deliver well over 100,000 vaccinations. Delivery at this scale substantially made the case for the new National Flu Vaccination Service.

Service payments

The erratic and opaque nature Enhanced service payments processing by commissioners continues to have a major impact on our contractors. The LPC continues to engage with commissioners at several levels to get these payments flowing.... We have worked with both Local Authorities to ensure that robust processes are now in place to ensure that claims are now processed in a timely manner with audits to pick up on any payments that may have got stuck in the labyrinthine Local Authority systems. Payments from NHS England are still erratic and we are working with them to overcome these problems. This is why it is vital that any such problems are flagged to your LPC so that we can help resolve such problems on your behalf.

Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment

The new PNAs came into effect in April 2015. The LPC worked with the Public Health team tasked with drafting the new PNAs to ensure they were fit for purpose. This was an important workstream that the LPC devoted considerable resource to.

Local Professional Networks (LPNs)

LPNs are intended to provide clinical input into local commissioning decisions. Their specific functions include:

- Supporting local authorities with development of the PNA
- Considering new programmes of work around self-care and long term conditions management in community pharmacy to achieve Outcome 2 of the NHS Outcomes Framework.
- Working with CCGs and others on medicines optimisation.
- "Holding the ring" on services commissioned locally by local authorities and CCGs, highlighting inappropriate gaps or overlaps.

Ash Soni OBE is Chair of the London LPN. He and his team are currently finalizing their structure, priorities and drafting workplans.

Healthy Living Pharmacy (HLP)

HLP was relaunched in December 2014, however contractors remained unclear on the application process. The LPC persuaded Public Health to appoint a HLP project manager to drive HLP forward. This was agreed and Chike Nwagwu was appointed as the new HLP project manager in May 2015. Our first 2 HLPs were accredited in July 2015, with many more in the pipeline.

Working with the Voluntary Sector

Camden Ageing Better bid

The committee has secured funding as part of the successful Camden Ageing Better bid for lottery funding. This is a strategic partnership with Age UK in Camden which will enable us to jointly deliver a service to identify isolated pensioners in Camden by using Pharmacies existing network of delivery drivers.

We have worked closely with Age UK Camden to develop the service and recruit the Pharmacies. The service is to go live in October 2015 and is already attracting attention from the National bodies and professional press.

Apprenticeship training

The apprenticeship program is a priority for this government. We have successfully partnered with Cite4Jobs to secure Local Education and Training Board funding for Apprenticeships across North Central London in conjunction with the Barnet, Enfield and Haringey LPC and City and Hackney LPC. This project is designed to equip individuals before recruitment with the Health Champion qualification as well as foundation level customer service training. This is completely free for the recruit and potential employer respectively

Constitution and Membership Changes

New Constitution

The committee adopted the new PSNC model constitution at its Special General Meeting held on 4 March 2015.

Membership changes

The elections saw Kim Khaki welcomed back to the committee. There have been a number of changes in the committees' first year with James Davies, Amit Shah and Neil Patel stepping down from the committee. We thank them for their hard work and efforts on behalf of contractors. We welcomed Chirag Nakum to the committee. The other vacancies were advertised in May 2015 and filled in July 2015.

The Vice chair Sanjay Patel stepped down in July 2015. The Company Chemist Association are still to appoint a replacement. Please see below an up to date Committee table.

Treasurers Report

The committee elected me as Treasurer in May 2015. Neil Patel had held this post before he stepped down in March 2015. Neil led much of the committees review of costs which has left us in a sound financial position for the future.

Reviewing the (attached) audited accounts and cash book analysis

- Local Education and Training Board (LETB) income – The committee successfully bid for funds from the local LETB to deliver training events.
- LPC member expenses – This has reduced substantially since the appointment of the CEO. As the CEO took over many of the tasks members had taken on in the absence of a CEO.
- Chief Officer fees in 2014-15 reflects the full year cost as the CEO started part way through the previous year
- Travel and Subsistence costs have increased and reflect the CEOs travel costs
- Admin Support costs have reduced as the CEO reviewed the admin duties
- London LPC forum levies increased to reflect the work on the Vaccination service and other development areas
- Bank Balance – The bank balance has improved significantly as a result of cost rationalization and income from delivering LETB projects. Over the coming year I expect our costs to be driven down further. The balance is currently £187,769, which is ahead of our cashflow forecast.
- Contractor's levies – due to good cost and cash flow control we are not expecting to increase levies this year. In fact the last rise over 5 years ago.
