#### **Leadership and Improvement Review**

The leadership and improvement review has now concluded. Following feedback from the consultation process the structure and accountability of the Clinical Senates will remain the same. Each geographical senate will be hosted in a local NHS England team. For us this is the Central Midlands team based at Fosse House. The Clinical Senate will remain co-located with the Clinical Networks to ensure the best use is made of clinical input and advice. In respect of staffing the team remains the same with a dedicated senate manager and senate p.a. working with the co-chairs. There is a regional senate oversight group covering East Midlands, West Midlands and East of England. This is to ensure that communications are shared across the region and there is consistency in the senate's functions.

#### **Upper GI Cancer Review**

The East Midlands Clinical Senate has been approached by East Midlands Specialised Commissioning to offer clinical advice on the configuration of Upper GI Cancer services in the East Midlands. If you require any further information contact peter.hartshorn@nhs.net

#### **Lincolnshire Health and Care Review**

A clinical senate review of the Lincolnshire Health and Care Programme was held in Lincolnshire in October 2015. A small clinical panel is due to meet with the teams again in June to hear about the updated clinical models being developed.

We have been asked to undertake a clinical review of proposals for the future of services at Bedfordshire and Milton Keynes hospitals We are particularly seeking input from clinicians from Urgent and Emergency Care, Maternity and Paediatrics.
