

## **Split Prescriptions**

## Factsheet for GP practice staff

A split prescription is one which is separated into an electronic and a paper prescription. This occurs when a patient has a nomination in place and one or more items cannot be sent electronically.

Top tips...
Find out how to identify items which can be sent by EPS. On some systems there will be a logo next to the items in the pick list.

A prescription item cannot be sent electronically if

- It is a schedule 1,2,3 controlled drug or
- It is an item that is not mapped in your systems drug dictionary.

Top tips...
Check to see if the latest drug dictionary is running on your system.

Top tips...

Prescribe in units, not in packs.

For example: 200 dose instead of one inhaler. 500mls instead of one pack of 500ml.

Top tips...
When authorising repeat
prescriptions update your
repeat master' with dm+d
repeat master ensuring they
mapped items ensuring they
can all be processed
electronically.

There are some options available.

 Replace the item with another description of the same product that is dm+d mapped and can be sent through EPS.

An example of this would be a patient having a repeat template with an unmapped product e.g. Glyceryl trinitrate 400micrograms/dose sublingual spray. Glyceryl trinitrate 400micrograms/dose aerosol sublingual spray and Glyceryl trinitrate 400micrograms/dose pump sublingual spray are both available as valid dm+d concepts. The prescriber would need to choose either the aerosol or pump for the patient to enable this to go via EPS.

- Split the prescription. Send some items electronically and print a paper FP10 prescription for the other items.
- Do not split the prescription. Print a paper FP10 prescription for all the items after discussing with the patient.

Add a note to the electronic

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prescription advising the
pharmacist that a paper one has
pharmacist that a paper on also been generated and to make
arrangements for it to be
collected.

Top tips...
You can prescribe by individual
You can prescribe by individual
flavour or use a generic flavourless
description and apply the
'AF' (assorted flavours) endorsements
For example: nutritional supplements
could be prescribed as individual
flavours or as non-flavoured with
flavours or as non-slavoured with
the 'AF' option selected.
