<b>Page / Section</b>	<b>Updated Text</b>
Page 8: Quantity to be administered and/or supplied	Single dose of 1500 or 3000 micrograms to be supplied. The patient <b>does not</b> need to be observed taking the medication. The pharmacist should seek assurance from the patient they will take the dose as soon as possible and within 72 hours of UPSI or potential contraception failure when taking away
Page 11: Written information to be given to the patient or carer	The patient should be given the following written information if appropriate <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The product specific information sheet supplied with the medicine</li><li>• <b>Provide or direct the patient</b> to a copy of the family planning association (FPA) leaflet "Your guide to emergency contraception" (available at <a href="http://www.fpa.org.uk/resources/downloads">www.fpa.org.uk/resources/downloads</a>)</li></ul>

Please place this Temporary Adjustment note with the PGD.

Pharmacists may use their professional judgement on how they provide emergency hormonal contraception providing they take steps to minimise patient risk and be mindful of potential for abuse with due regard to safeguarding.

Any provision and use of professional judgement must give due consideration to the latest advice given by the General Pharmaceutical Council and Royal Pharmaceutical Society.
